

Collegeville Township Planning Commission

Meeting Minutes
October 23, 2018

On Tuesday, October 23, 2018 the Collegeville Township Planning Commission met for their regular monthly meeting. Present were Board members Megan McNair (chair), Allen Schmitz, Allan Eisenschenk, Ralph Leither, Dave Dingmann, and Deputy Clerk Denise Guggenberger. The meeting was called to order by Megan McNair at 8:00pm.

- 1) Tim Herzog- 15355 Knightwood Rd, Cold Spring, MN – Accessory Building Replacement Permit – 24ft x 32ft shed with 24ft x 8ft covered porch for personal storage. Removing existing pole shed and replacing with new building.
Allen Schmitz motioned to approve accessory building replacement permit, seconded by Ralph Leither, motioned carried.
- 2) Lynn Schurman – 26732 168th Ave., Cold Spring, MN –Deck Replacement Accessory Permit. Replace existing patio deck with stairs with new 4ft x 20ft new patio deck and stairway.
Ralph Leither motioned to approve deck replacement accessory permit, seconded by Dave Dingmann, motioned carried.
- 3) Greg Haeg-14246 Fruit Farm Road, St Joseph, MN –Driveway approach permit –new patio deck and stairway.
Allen Schmitz motioned to approve driveway approach permit, seconded by Dave Dingmann, motioned carried.
- 4) Discuss shooting range and noise levels in Collegeville Township.
Wakefield and Collegeville Planning Commission members discussed the Stearns County shooting range ordinances. The Stearns County Land Use and Zoning Ordinance references the NRA Sourcebook on shooting range restrictions. Planning Commission will review the township outlay and see if any property would meet Stearns County Ordinances.
